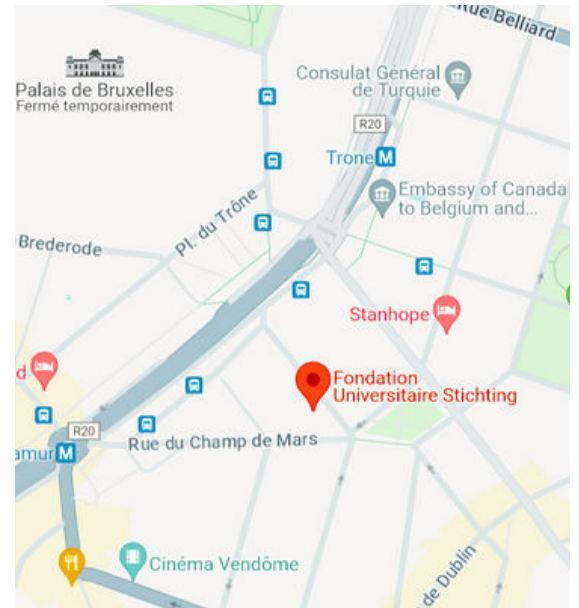

Logistical Information

- **Address:** Fondation Universitaire, 11 Rue d'Egmont, 1000 Brussels. The entrance is unlocked and you will be let in by the Fondation's front desk.
- **Venue:** **Room Cattier** is on the ground floor, at the very end of the corridor.



How to get there via public transport?

- **Nearest metro stations:** Trone and Namur, lines 2 and 6 (5 mins away);
- **Nearest buses:** Lines 80, 34, 12, 64, 95 (2-5 mins away). Lines 12 and 21 stop at the European Parliament (15 mins away) and connect to the Brussels Airport;
- **Nearest train station:** Brussels-Luxembourg (9 mins away).
